
ANNUAL FUND -SHARE



July 1 2023

Committee review applications and submits recommended projects to TRF

Mid-Sept 2023

Club notified of Grant status. Funds transferred electronically to Clubs



Interim Report through ClubRunner showing progress of project.

May 31 2024

Final report through ClubRunner. Can be submitted as soon as project is completed.

June 2024
