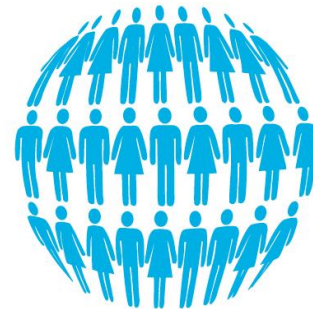

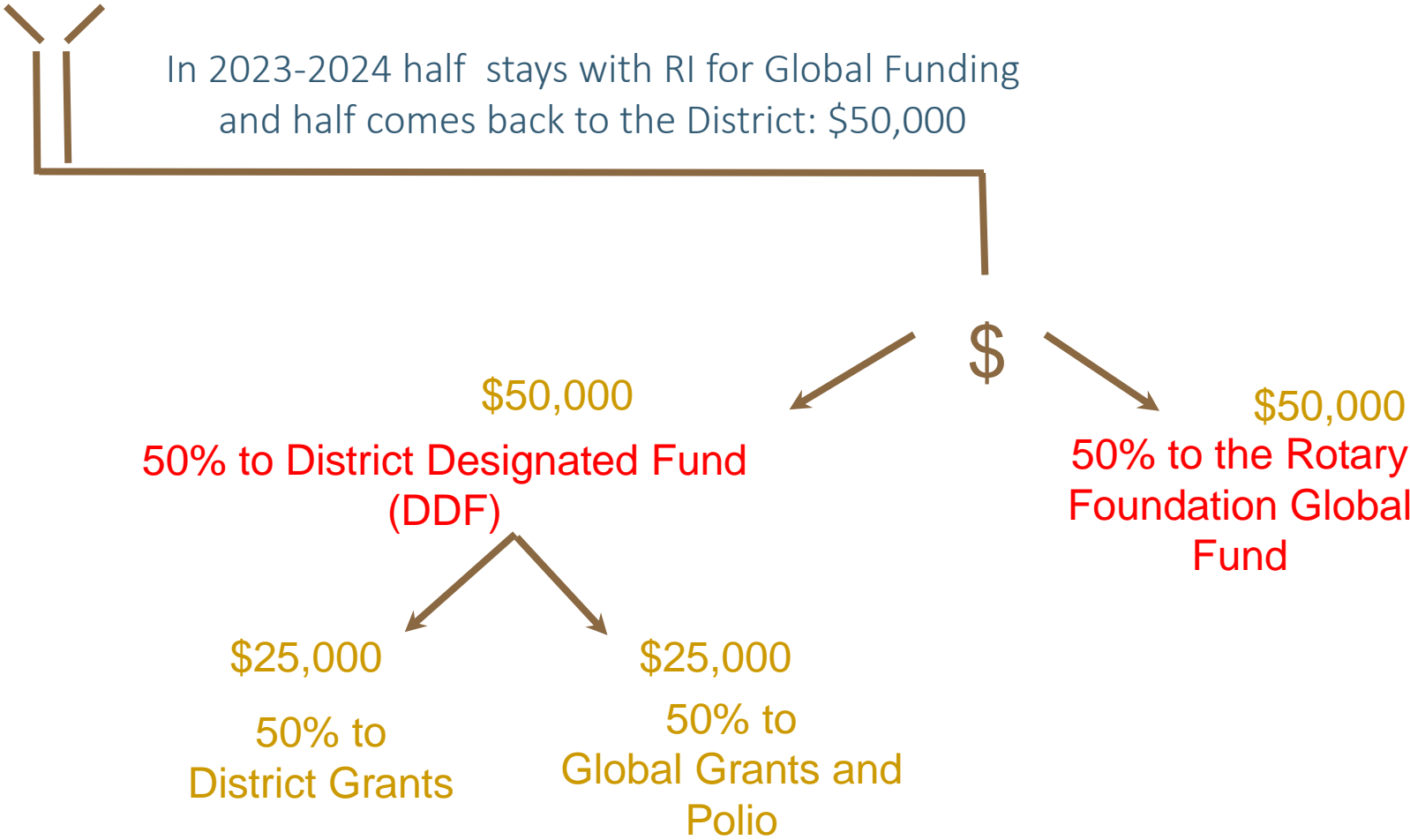

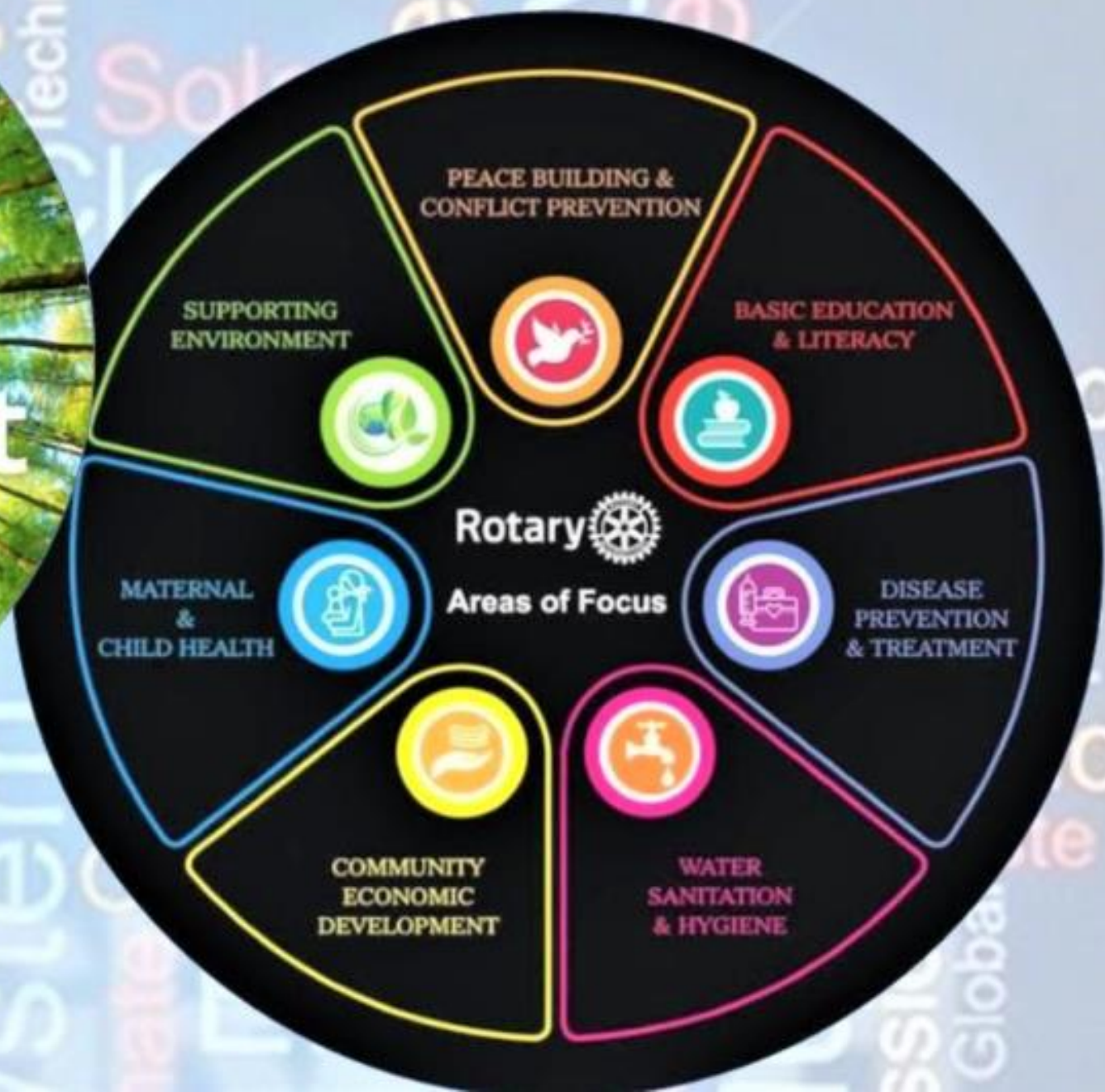

Rotaract and Rotary clubs must contribute at least the same amount as the District Grant

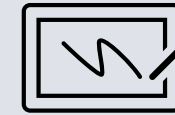
Up to \$3000 match available per project

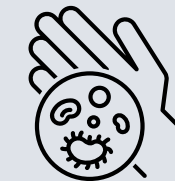

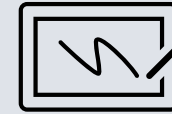

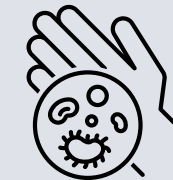
